Countable Nouns



- Countable nouns are nouns that we can count.

singular form



cake

plural form



cakes

- They refer to **objects, people, or things** that can be individually identified and quantified.

Countable Nouns



☐ a / an + countable noun → a single item

EXAMPLES



a cat



an apple

☐ numbers / quantifiers + countable noun → specific quantities
(a few, few, many, any, ...)

EXAMPLES



seven cats



many apples



Uncountable Nouns

- Uncountable nouns are nouns that we can't count.

Can you count milk?

NO!



- Countable nouns can have only a singular form.

~~milks~~



Uncountable Nouns

- They refer to substances, concepts, or qualities that are considered to be a whole or mass.

□ **quantifiers**
(much, some, any, ...)

+

uncountable noun

EXAMPLES



some / much rice



some / much time
